**LOCATION**

The Pepsi Coliseum is a one-sheet ice facility, with the ice surface measuring 200 feet by 85 feet, with slightly rounded corners. The Pepsi Coliseum is located within the Indiana State Fairgrounds at: 1202 E. 38<sup>th</sup> St, Indianapolis, IN 46205.

**FACILITIES**

Dressing rooms will be available during practice ice and competition. Please check-in at the registration desk to receive locker room assignments. Snack bar and full service pro shop will be open for your convenience during the competition.

**SANCTIONING**

This non-qualifying competition is sanctioned by US Figure Skating and will be conducted in accordance with the rules as set forth in the 2012 rulebook, accept as modified in this announcement. **Chief Referee: Kathy Slack.**

**ENTRIES & ELIGIBILITY**

Eligible competitors are current members in good standing of the USFS and shall be eligible to enter events based on their test status as of October 12, 2011. A minimum of two entries will be required for all flights to be scheduled. Entrants may compete at their current test level as of October 19, 2011, or one level above, but not both in any one event except Solo Dance (skaters may compete in two levels). The competition is open to all eligible skaters who have registered for the 2011-12 year and are either residents of Indiana or current members of an Indiana club. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries, October 12, 2011. All Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills Skaters through Basic 8 must skate at the highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

**AWARDS**

Medals will be awarded for the first three places in each group. Ribbons will be awarded for the remaining placements. Awards will be presented shortly after the results for each event are posted. Skaters receiving awards should appear dressed in their competition outfits and skates and skate guards for the awards ceremonies.

**BEST ALL AROUND SKATER AWARD**

The Best All Around Skater award will be awarded to the top three Novice, Junior and Senior level skaters accumulating the most points during the competition. The points are accrued by the placement awarded for each of four events in which the skater competes. Although he/she may compete in more events, the skater may choose a maximum of four events to apply toward this award, two of which must be the Short and Long Programs. The higher level of success in these chosen events, the more points accumulated. The skater must indicate on the entry form by circling the events he/she would like used toward the Best All Around Skater Award. The Indiana Council of Figure Skating Clubs has donated these trophies.

**CHALLENGE TROPHY**

The Challenge Team Trophy will be awarded to the club earning the highest accumulation of points based on the following point system: 1<sup>st</sup> place – 5 point; 2<sup>nd</sup> place – 4 points; 3<sup>rd</sup> place – 3 points; 4<sup>th</sup> place – 2 points; 5<sup>th</sup> place – 1 point.

**FEES**

- \$65.00 All first singles events (except Basic Skills)
- \$60.00 First pairs or couples dance event (\$30 per skater)
- \$25.00 each additional event (including solo dance)
- \$45.00 Basic Skills event
- \$20.00 Each additional basic skills event

Returned checks will have a \$20 fee.

### **CLOSING DATE**

All entries must be postmarked by **October 12, 2011**. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the competition committee with a \$15.00 late fee. No refunds will be made unless the event is cancelled due to lack of entries.

### **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS**

A tentative schedule will be emailed to coaches and competitors prior to the competition date. Coaches and skaters will receive an email confirmation of practice ice and events. Please check-in at the registration table upon arrival on the day of the competition for any changes in the schedule. No admission fee will be charged for any event.

### **PRACTICE ICE**

The Practice Ice Form must be sent with the Entry Form. Practice ice will be \$10 per 20 minute session and will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis. Practice ice will be available Saturday, November 12 in the morning and afternoon and Sunday, November 13 in the morning only. Sessions will be limited to a maximum of 20 skaters per session.

### **REGISTRATION**

The registration desk will be open in the lobby of the Pepsi Coliseum one hour prior to the first event of each day and remain open throughout the day's events. Please register promptly upon arrival and turn in any music required for your events.

### **BASIC SKILLS MUSIC**

### **MUSIC**

Please turn in music to the registration desk upon check-in. Music must be received at least one hour prior to the event. CD's must be a music CD, no CD-RW will be accepted. ## **BASIC SKILLS ELEMENTS EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM – BASIC 8**

Each skater will perform each element when directed by a judge or referee or have the option to perform one element at a time in the order listed below (no excessive connecting steps). Referee driven format examples: all skaters perform first element before moving on to the next and so on **OR** each skater performs all of the required elements before moving on to the next skater.

- To be skated on 1/3 to 1/2 ice
- No music
- **All elements must be skated in the order listed**
- Time: 1:00 or less

## **BASIC SKILLS EVENTS PROGRAM EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM – BASIC 8**

- The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified. Vocal music is allowed.
- To be skated on half ice.
- CDs of the 2011 Indiana state competition music will be provided to coaches by request.
- The skater may use elements from a previous level.
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level.

## COMPULSORY EVENTS

- In program form, using a limited number of connecting steps, the skating order of required elements is optional.
- To be skated on ½ ice.
- No music is allowed.
- A deduction will be taken for additional or repeated elements.
- Skaters may have the option of to skate one level higher in compulsories than their free skate program.
- Double jumps may not be substituted for single jumps. An Axel is considered a single jump.
- Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between jumps.
- Spins must be at least 4 revolutions unless otherwise stated.

## **FREESKATE EVENTS**

### Technical Data Concerning Competition Events:

- Free Skating requirements are according to the 2012 Rulebook.
- Free Skating Events – Well-Balanced Program and Competitive Test Track.
- Short Program and Free Skating are separate events.
- IJS judging system will be used for Short Program (Intermediate through Senior) and Well-Balanced Free Skating (Juvenile through Senior). Deductions will be made for including elements not permitted in the event description.
- IJS planned program form can be found on the US Figure Skating web site. This form must be e-mailed to US Figure Skating headquarters.
- Skaters may enter the event for which they have passed the required test or one level higher (i.e. Skaters may “skate up” one level) except as noted below and not more than one level in any event.
- Times stated for Free Skating events are +/- 10 seconds.
- Skaters may enter EITHER the Test Track or the Well-Balanced Free Skate, but NOT BOTH. All Test Track events will be judged under the 6.0 system.

## TEST TRACK PROGRAM EVENT

Skaters may enter EITHER test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but **NOT** both during the same non qualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice, vocal music permitted. The 6.0 judging system will be used for all Test Track events.

Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

- 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.

The program will be judged primarily on style and presentation of the theme. We encourage each skater to be creative in his or her costume. Only hand held props will be allowed.

Skaters placing first through fourth in the Preliminary level and higher in Artistic Showcase solo events, including Adult events may be qualified to enter the next National Showcase. ## **INTERPRETIVE**

Following the warm-up all skaters except for the first skater will be escorted to a soundproof locker room or another area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time and then perform a program to the music. As each skater performs, the next skater in line will be allowed to hear the music for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time before they perform to the music. The listening skater will not be allowed to view the performing skater. There is to be no instruction allowed during this event from coaches, parents, or fellow skaters. Staging area must be kept clear except for ice monitor and listening competitor. Skaters are judged on interpretation of the music only.
